## **Generate an action plan to carry out different actions to raise awareness and provide information on labour issues**

### **Name:**

To generate an action plan to carry out actions to raise awareness and provide information on labour issues.

### **Description:**

By 2021, Chile, as a pioneer country of Alliance 8.7, pledges to generate priority actions on child labour and migrant populations, child labour and gender, and protected youth labour. Actions will be framed in communication and awareness-raising strategies targeting the various actors in the world of work, the general population, state services/professionals and related organizations, with training for relevant actors. Taking into consideration the crisis situation affecting the migrant population, which has been strongly impacted by the health crisis, it is important to make progress on raising awareness and providing information on the prevention of child labour.

Likewise, during the year 2021, Law No. 21,271 will enter into force, amending the Labour Code on the protection of children and adolescents in the world of work. The regulation of this law will determine the activities considered as hazardous work, and includes guidelines aimed at preventing this type of work, aimed at employers and educational establishments, to protect the rights of adolescents of working age. Thus, The dissemination of the new regulations and the list of hazardous work will be essential to move towards protected youth labour.

### **Implementation plan:**

Through an action plan and planning that incorporates the implementation of specific actions to address priority areas and move towards increased information and awareness of child labour and the importance of its eradication.

### **Impact:**

Prioritizing specific issues and target audiences allows Chile to highlight and disseminate the issue, thereby contributing to the prevention of child labour and providing information on new regulations to progress towards protected youth labour.
