Ending Child Labour in Timor-Leste; through approval of Child Labour National Action Plan.

Description:

The National Commission against Child Labour jointly with its tripartite organizations commemorate the International Year on the Elimination of Child Labour by pledging three points as a joint commitment to fight Child Labour in Timor-Leste.

- Support and urge the Government to immediately approve Child Labour National Action Plan in 2021. Child Labour National Action Plan is vital for Timor-Leste for combating Child Labour
- Support the Government to conduct legal analysis as a basis for the ratification of ILO Convention 138 and the harmonization of the age minimum for admission to the world of work for Timor-Leste.
- Urge the Government to approve the draft hazardous worklist to strengthen the work of Labour Inspectors as part of combating child labour in Timor-Leste.

Implementation plan:

National Commission against child labour will work together with its tripartite organizations to monitor and ensure relevant line ministries within the government implement the agreed actions in the National Action Plan on Child Labour.

Impact:

Once the National Action Plan on Child Labour and Hazardous worklist will be approved by the government, it will guide and strengthen the work of government institution such as the Commission against Child Labour and the Labour Inspector office to its work in combating and ending Child Labour in Timor-Leste.
