Implement the national training and awareness-raising strategy to prevent and eradicate child labour

Description:

In 2021, the Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare (STPS), in collaboration with Save the Children Mexico, will develop a training course with a rights-based approach to address the problem of child labour in the different levels of government, which will be aimed at the 32 Commissions of the National Network of Local Commissions for the Prevention and Eradication of Child Labour, as well as labour inspectors at federal and local level, members of the Inter-Ministerial Commission for the Prevention and Eradication of Child Labour and the Protection of Adolescent Workers of Permitted Age in Mexico (CITI), public sector; private initiative; and civil society that perform functions for the prevention, detection, protection and eradication of child labour.

Digital platforms and information and communication technologies (ICTs) will be used for this purpose.

Implementation plan:

- A) produce a diagnosis of training needs in the 32 Local Commissions for the Prevention and Eradication of Child Labour;
- B) develop course content based on the results of the diagnosis;
- C) launch the course as a pilot for a representative of the National Network of Local Commissions and eight federal labour inspectors;
- D) feedback and improvement;
- E) launch to a broader audience.

Impact:

The actors involved in the training will acquire up-to-date information, knowledge and skills relevant and necessary to develop, implement and enforce national and local provisions, regulations, policies and actions aimed at eradicating child labour.
