### **Name:**

Through coordinated action we empower communities to improve their livelihoods, and urge governments and companies to ensure fair supply chains.

### **Description:**

The Work: No Child's Business (WNCB) Alliance - consisting of UNICEF, Save the Children and the Stop Child Labour coalition in India, Ivory Coast, Jordan, Mali, Uganda, Vietnam and the Netherlands - addresses the root causes of child labour, as well as the immediate needs of children and youth as a consequence of the pandemic. We work towards creating an enabling environment where children and youth can be free of child labour and enjoy their right to education, physical and mental wellbeing, vocational training and future decent work.

### **Implementation plan:**

In 2021 we will continue monitoring the situation, assess intervention strategies and accelerate coordinated action to enhance the economic empowerment of families, and the (re)integration of children into formal schools or vocational training. We actively support and promote an area-based approach involving all stakeholders to tackle root causes of child labour, and a supply chain approach addressing child rights violations in production and supply chains. We mobilize communities, businesses, governments and (international) organizations to take responsibility and act against child labour.

### **Impact:**

Mitigating the negative effects of Covid-19, tackling the root causes of child labour, mobilizing resources and activating all stakeholders to collaborate and be part of the solution, will bring sustainable change for children and their families. Empowered communities stand up for their right to education, future employability, decent living and working standards within safe and enabling environments. Governments, companies and (inter)national organizations will be encouraged and equipped to take measures to prevent/reduce child labour. On the international level we engage the European Union to promote national due diligence laws and have dialogues with governments and companies concerning binding due diligence responsibilities.
